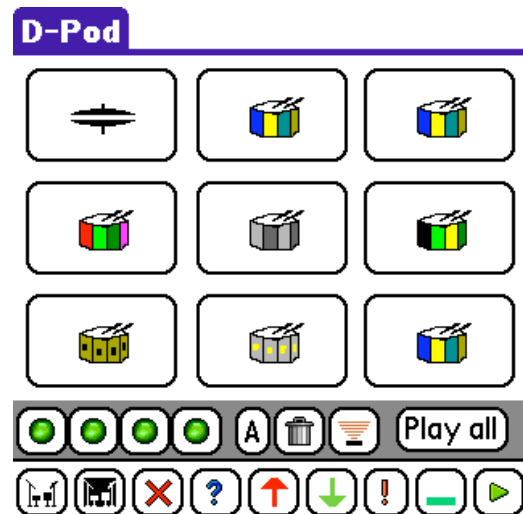


## D-Pod 1.3 Manual



### Introduction:

I decided to write a little bit more about D-Pod with version 1.2 as it has become a slightly more complicated application now, so it needs a bit of an explanation. So hopefully this will help.

### Application description:

D-Pod started out life as a very simple application that just made drum sounds. Over time it has changed and grown into more of a drum machine application, which is probably where it was always going. Where will it go in the future? I have no idea. 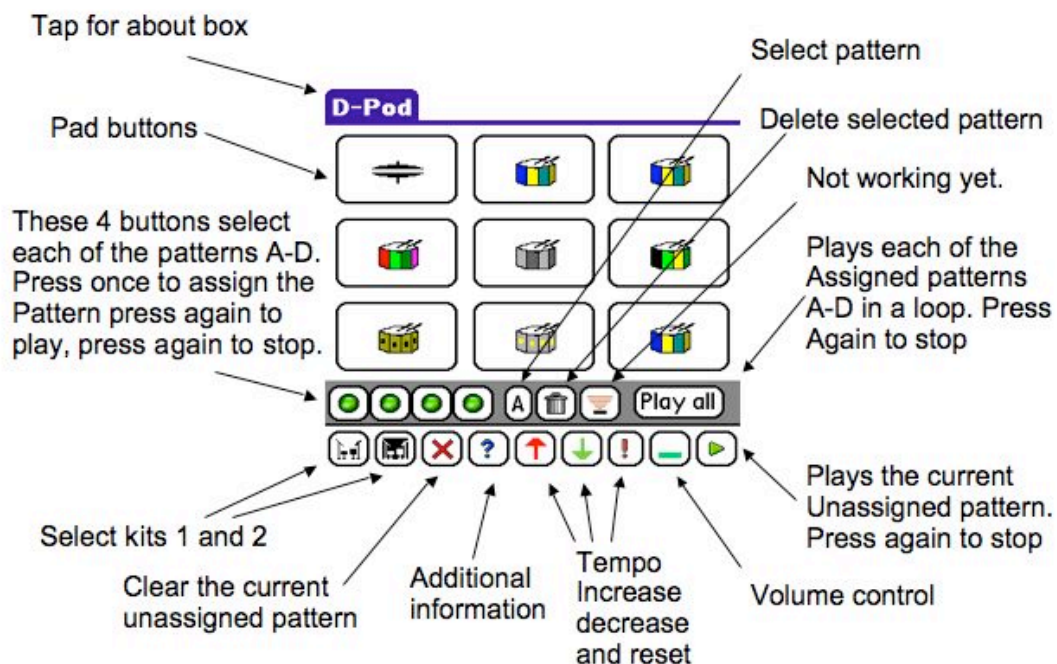
### About D-Pod

D-Pod now has 4 patterns that can be looped together making it into a very simple drum machine. It also remembers your work after you have exited from the application which is handy.

In addition D-Pod will now accept an incoming pattern from ranDRUM, the random drum pattern application. Tap on the D-Pod icon in ranDRUM and the pattern will go over from ranDRUM which will close, and D-Pod will launch.

## Description of what all the buttons do:

The following diagram explains what all the buttons do. The best way to find out is to have a go, and D-Pod is freeware, so it won't cost you anything.



## Limitations:

D-Pod is meant to be fun, and so isn't really a pro-music application. As such the timing isn't wonderful. At some point I may tidy this up.
