

Solitaire Poker

APPLICATION DESCRIPTION

- Four columns are to be completed with five cards each. The goal of the game is to achieve the best poker hand in each column. The first row is filled automatically, then tap on one of the columns to place the next card. You cannot begin a new row of cards before completing the previous row. You go on until all four columns have five cards. Then your final score is calculated.
- Tap on the *New* button or use the menu command to begin a new game.
- At the end of the game, tap anywhere on the cards to display the scores for each column. Moreover, you can tap on the *Best play* button in order to see the highest score you could have achieved had the cards been played differently. Note: the best play calculation is performed in native ARM code for handhelds equipped with an ARM processor and Palm OS 5.0 or later. After calculation, the best play is shown: the total and column scores of the best play are also displayed, along with those previously achieved by player (in square brackets).
- *Solitaire Poker* follows the Italian poker rules. 32 cards are used: for each of the four suits, ranks range from 7 (seven, the lowest card) to A (ace, the highest card). There are no wild cards. Moreover, a straight can be achieved also with the combination A-7-8-9-10.
- Your final score is the sum of the values of the hands achieved in each column. The value of each hand is as follows:
 - ➡ One Pair: 20 points
 - ➡ Two Pairs: 40 points
 - ➡ Three of a Kind: 100 points
 - ➡ Straight: 150 points
 - ➡ Full House: 200 points
 - ➡ Flush: 300 points
 - ➡ Four of a Kind: 500 points
 - ➡ Straight Flush: 1000 points
- The *Statistics* screen displays the three best scores with date and time stamps, the worst score, the overall number of games played and the average score per game. Tap *Clear* to clear all statistic data.
- In the *Options* screen the following options are shown:
 - ➡ *Use application buttons*: activate this option to use hardware application buttons (*Date Book*, *Address Book*, *To Do* and *Memo Pad*) to select the first, second, third and fourth column respectively. At the end of the game, press again to show the score for each column, then press one more time to start a new game. In this way, you can play several games without using your stylus.
 - ➡ *Auto-complete rows*: activate this option to let the last column be filled automatically. In this way you select only where to place the first three cards for each row; the fourth card is then placed automatically in the only available column.

- ➡ **Animation:** choose what kind of animation should be performed when a card is played. You can select from:
 - **None:** when a card is played, it is put on the appropriate column at once, without any animation.
 - **Slow:** when a card is played, it will move slowly from the *Next card* pile towards the selected column on the desk.
 - **Fast:** when a card is played, it will move quickly from the *Next card* pile towards the selected column on the desk.
- *Solitaire Poker* can be actually played also as a betting game. An unlimited number of players is allowed. The number of games to play is determined. Then players take turns until everyone has completed her games. Then the final standing is determined by means of the overall score and the winner takes a prize from the losers proportional to the score gap. As an alternative, players can decide that the first is paid by the last, the second by the last but one, and so on. Of course, I suggest not to set high prizes; be aware that differences of 1000 points are not uncommon. I do not want anyone to be ruined!
- Meaning of the menu commands:
 - ➡ **New:** start a new game
 - ➡ **Statistics:** show statistics about previous games
 - ➡ **Options:** show game options
 - ➡ **Instructions:** show a brief help summarizing the rules
 - ➡ **About:** show some information about the application and its author
