1. Introduction

Thank you for trying out Address XT®, a powerful replacement for the standard address book application. It offers handy new features while keeping user interface as close as possible to user interface of built-in address book. In addition, Address XT uses standard databases for 100% compatibility with your existing applications.

Address XT integrates with Manage XT by Handydev to allow easy modification of large groups of contacts.

1.1 Contents

1.2 Technical requirements

Address XT requires PalmOS 4.0 or later. It takes up 297Kb of RAM on the device.

1.3 Installing Address XT

AddressXT.prc needs to be installed on your PalmOS ® - powered device to use the software. Usually this is done using Palm Install Tool. Please refer to the documentation that came with your handheld for instructions on how to use the Palm Install Tool.

If your device system software supports contact photos (that is, if your device is one of the following list: Palm Tx, Z22, Zire 72, Treo 650, Tungsten T3, Tungsten T5, Tungsten E, Tungsten E2, LifeDrive Mobile Manager), install pnoJpegLib.prc. On other devices, you do not need install this file.

On the first run Address XT will be configured using default settings optimized for your device. You can change settings later in Option screens. Additionally the application will ask you to map it to hardware button or Phone Favorites button (you can also change this setting later in the Button Options screen).

1.4 Mapping Address XT to hardware “Address Book” button

If your PalmOS device is equipped with hardware buttons, you can map the hardware “Address Book” button to start Address XT application. To do so, start Address XT and select “Button Options...” in the Options menu. Check or uncheck “Map to Hardware Button” checkbox to enable or disable key mapping to Address XT.

1.5 High-Resolution devices support notes

Address XT supports screen resolutions 160*160 and 320*320. Additionally, it supports Sony Clie 320*480 and 480*320 screen resolutions and Palm or Tapwave Zodiac 320*480 and 480*320 screen resolutions.

1.6 *Contacts application compatibility*

Address XT is compatible with all the extended text fields of the Contacts application.

Address XT lets you view and edit all the extended fields offered by the Contacts application, except for the “Photo” field. You can view contact photos on devices that have Contacts application (Zire 72, Treo 650, Tungsten T3, Tungsten T5, Tungsten E, Tungsten E2, LifeDrive Mobile Manager). You cannot edit contact photos with current Address XT version. Use your desktop software or the Contacts application to assign photo to a contact. Future versions of Address XT will support photo editing in-house.

On devices that do not have photo support in the built-in Contacts application you will need to set contact photos using your desktop software (Palm Desktop, for example).

Address XT does not currently support the anniversary and ringtone fields available on Treo 700p. However, such support will be added in future versions.

2. Application overview

Address XT resembles standard Address Book application in many ways. Here we will explain only the extended features of Address XT.

2.1 Enhanced Address List on high resolution – capable devices

Address XT® allows to effectively increase quantity of information visible in Address List by up to 100% or even more. This is done using high-resolution fonts on the devices which support Sony or Palm high-resolution modes. “Small fonts” mode can be enabled in Address List Options.

2.2 New sorting options

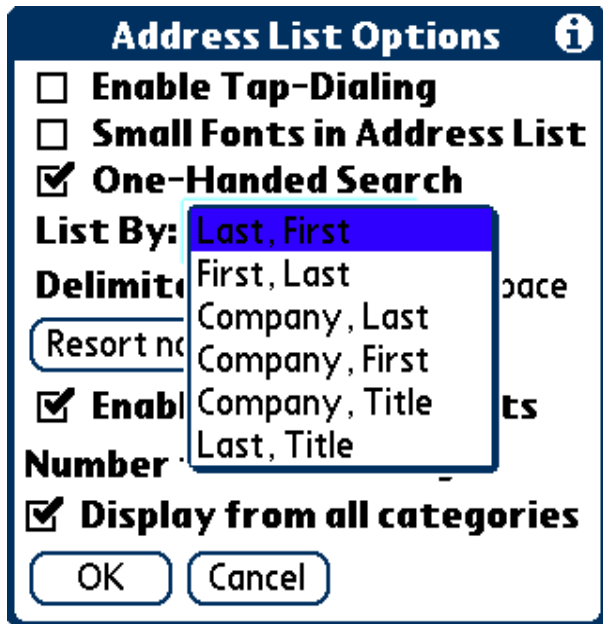


Fig. 2.2.1 – new sorting options in the Address List options screen

Address XT introduces 4 new Address List sorting options, as can be seen on Fig. 2.2.1

These options affect how the Address List will look like. For example, if you choose “Company, Title” sorting option, all the contacts will be sorted by company, and then by title. Also, these fields will be displayed in Address List view.


2.3 Purge category

Address XT features a Purge category menu command which can be accessed from Address List "Record" menu. It lets you quickly delete all records from current category.

Be careful using this option!

2.4 Enter company data

“Enter company data” command allows you to quickly set various fields for all the contacts working in a selected company.

Suppose some company, where you have a couple of contacts, has just moved to another city or changed its e-mail domain. Instead of re-typing the same info for every contact, you just go to “Enter Company Data” screen, select a company that moved, and enter all the fields that have changed. Press the “Set” button – and all the contacts working in the company will be updated.

Enter Company Data screen can be accessed from Address List “Record” menu.

Note that entering a new e-mail domain changes only the part of e-mail address that's after the '@' sign. For example, setting the e-mail domain to “sw.ny.us.com” will change e-mail address “smith@wst.org” to “smith@sw.ny.us.com”

You can set up Address XT to replace only empty fields. This option is set from the Enter Company Data screen Options menu (“Preferences...” item).

2.5 Birthday reminder

Birthday reminder allows you to store birth date for any of address book entries and optionally set up reminders for birthdays.




Figure 2.5.1 – Address Entry Details

Birth date can be entered by tapping “Details...” button in the Address Edit screen. Here, you can set birth date by tapping date selector, remove birthday by tapping the ‘Clear’ button and set birthday reminder by checking the “Remind” checkbox and entering number of days to be reminded by.




Figure 2.5.3 – Reminders screen

Birthday reminder is visible in any application which has an standard PalmOS title bar (Fig. 2.5.2). When you tap on attention asterisk, the reminders screen pops up (Fig. 2.5.3).

At this screen, you see a list of forthcoming birthdays with short information about the corresponding person.

To clear an reminder, check the corresponding checkbox. To open address book entry of the contact who's birthday is coming, just tap on his or her name.

Beaming feature of Address XT is extended to support the new “Birthday” field. This means that you can exchange contacts over IR or Bluetooth with birthday information with devices that support vCard standard and which have the “Birthday” field. If birthday is entered for a contact, it can be seen in Address View (Fig. 2.5.4).

Birthday information is stored in a separate database named “AddrXTDB2”. If you delete Address XT from your device, birthday information will be also deleted if your device comes without preinstalled Contacts application. If you choose to reinstall Address XT, you can restore birthday information by installing “AddrXTDB2.pdb” file which is backed up to your Palm Desktop user directory during each HotSync.

2.6 General options

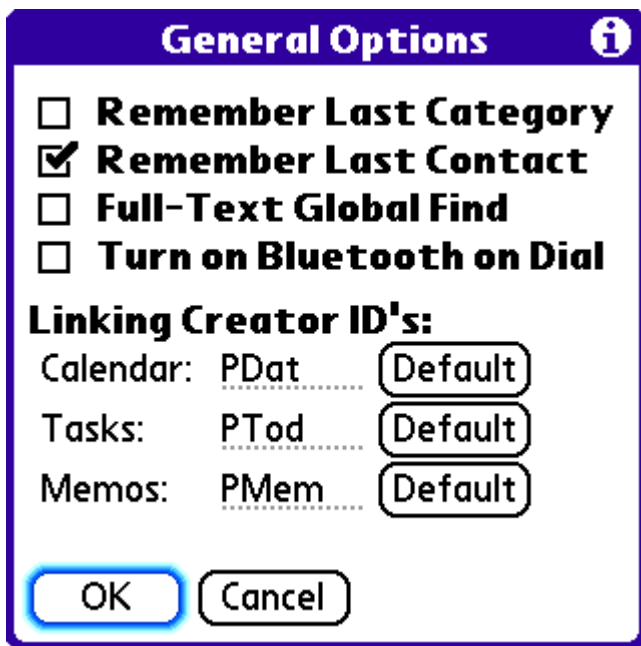


Figure 2.6.1 - General Options screen

When the “Remember Last Contact” option is set, Address XT will open the last contact if you exited Address XT while viewing it, or will scroll to that contact if you exited from Address List.

Here is an example of what Full-Text Global Find option does:

When searching for a string 'mit' (using the System Find), Address XT will always find records like “John Mitts” where one of the fields starts with the string you are searching for. However, if the Full-text search option is on, Address XT will also find entries like “Albert Gormitter” or “Alice Smith” where the search string can be located in any part of address fields.

Note that Global Find is always caseless.

“Turn on Bluetooth on Dial” option, if checked, will attempt to turn Bluetooth on every time you dial a contact. It is available on all Bluetooth-equipped devices except Treo smartphones.

The “One-Handed Search” option, when available, lets you turn off contact lookup by letter using 5-Way Navigator or 4-Way JogDial.

Linking options let you set up which applications will open contact links. To revert to a default application, tap the corresponding “Default” button.

To determine Creator ID for the application that should open links, use file-management utility like Filez. Note that third-party applications may not support opening a link from Address XT. If an application with a specified Creator ID can't be found, link will be opened using a default application for that link type.

2.7 Button options

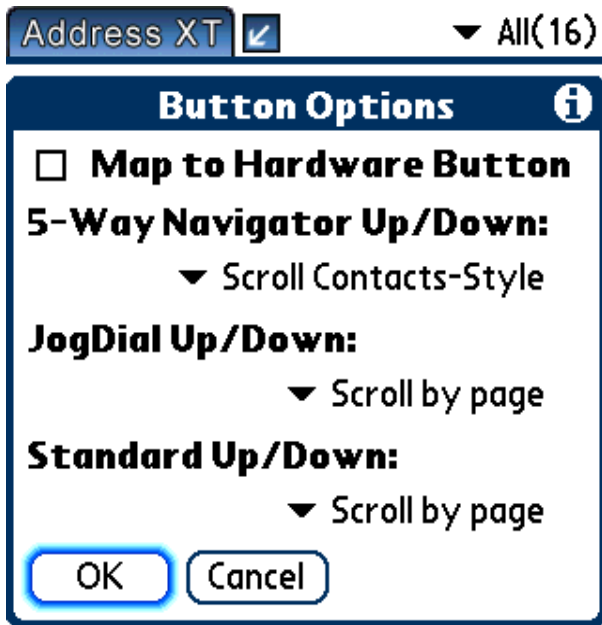


Fig. 2.7.1 – Button Options screen

Button options screen lets you set up the way various buttons function in the Address List screen. In the current version, you can set up the way JogDial, 5-Way Navigator and standard up/down buttons scroll the Address List.

Contacts-style scrolling for the 5-Way Navigator lets you switch between page and record scrolling using the 5-Way Navigator. Switch from page scrolling to record scrolling using the "Select" button, when the lookup field is empty. Switch from page scrolling to record scrolling using the "Left" button when the lookup field is empty. This mode is analogous to record scrolling in the Contacts application.

On Treo smartphones, "Map to Favorites" option is available instead of "Map to Hardware Button". It sets Address XT to first Phone Favorites button. The application that was there previously is moved to first free button available.

2.8 Address List Options

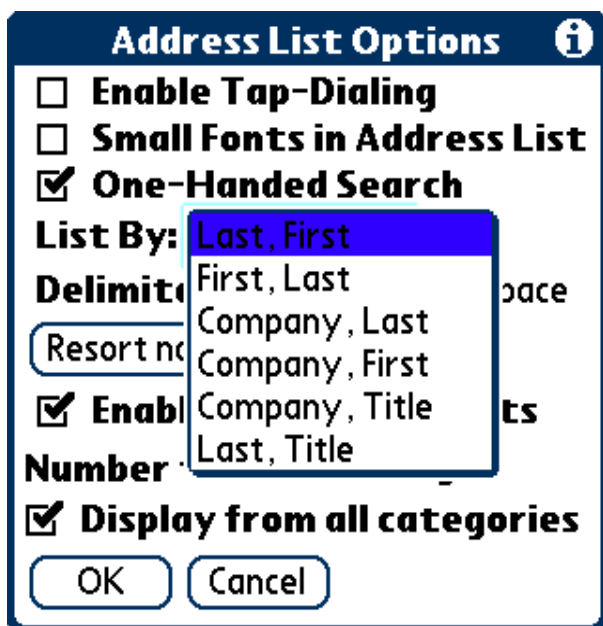


Fig 2.8.1 – Address List Options

Tap “Resort now” to force database resort using selected sort mode.

Address XT supports one-handed search in Address List using 5-Way Navigator. Press Right to add an letter to a search string, and press Left to remove one letter. Press Up and Down to change current letter. If multiple records satisfy the search criteria, press Up and Down to select between them. To enable one-hand search, select the “One-Handed Search” checkbox.

You can also select recent contacts options and choose database sorting mode from this screen. To select how record fields are delimited, select a corresponding option in the “Delimiter” list.

“Advanced Find” feature lets you find contacts using both displayed names. If this option is deselected, only first displayed name will be searched.

2.9 Send E-Mail To Contact

Address XT provides integration with any PalmOS Helper API – compatible e-mail application (including VersaMail and SnapperMail).

You can send e-mail to contact using such application from Address View or Address Edit screen, using Record menu.

Note that “Send E-Mail To Contact” menu item appears only if selected contact has one or more e-mail address and if you have compatible e-mail application installed. Once you tap “E-Mail To Contact”, the Select E-Mail Address form appears (Fig. 2.9.2).

Once you select an e-mail address and press OK, your e-mail application will show an e-mail compose form. Once you send the message, you will get back to Address XT.

If your e-mail account is not configured in your e-mail application, you will get an error message stating that e-mail application can not be started.

2.10 Color Options

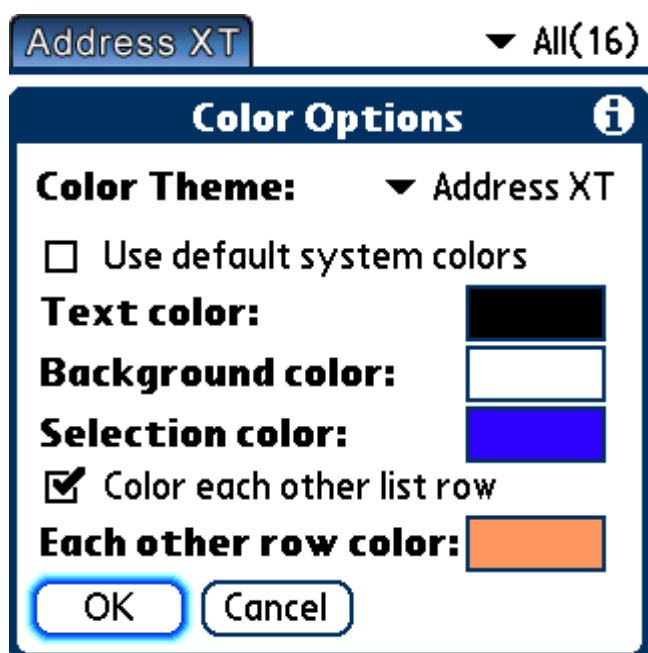


Fig. 2.10.1 – Color Options screen.

You may set application colors using the Color Options. It is accessible from the Options menu in Address List, Contact and Contact Edit forms.

Set your custom text, background and selection colors in the Color Options or check “Use default system colors” to revert to the standard color scheme.

Check the “Color each other list row” checkbox to select color for each other Address List row.

If your device supports colors, you may select one of pre-defined color themes from a corresponding list.

2.11 Number of records in Category

Address XT displays number of records in current category. The number is displayed in the upper-right corner of the Address List.

2.12 Manage XT integration

Address XT integrates with Manage XT to allow you to easily modify large groups of records. If Manage XT is found in your handheld RAM, it can be started from the Record menu of the Contacts List screen.

2.13 Recent Contacts feature

The Recent Contacts feature allows you to view the list of recently opened contacts and easily access any recent record.

The Recent Contacts feature can be enabled or disabled by "Options – Address List Options..." menu of the contacts list screen. You may also select the number of stored recent contacts.

If you check "Always display all entries", you will access all recent contacts from any category. Otherwise, only recent contact entries which belong to current category will be displayed.

If "Always display all entries" checkbox in the Recent Options is selected, Note that recent contacts are shown for current category. To view all recent contacts, you should select the 'All' category first.

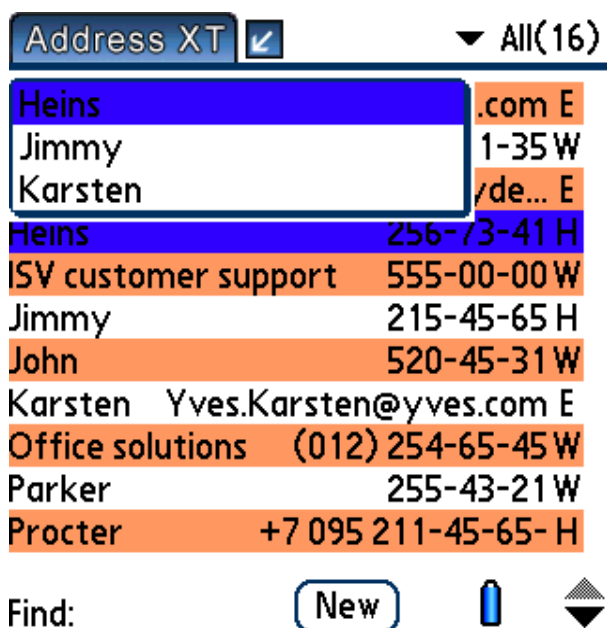



Fig. 2.13.1 – Address List with Recent Contacts

2.14 Birthday List

The "Birthday List" feature (Fig. 2.14.1) lets you view list of birthdays for any selected month. To use it, select "Birthday List" from the Record menu of Address XT's list of contacts. Tap on any record in Birthday List to open it.

2.15 Contact Links

You can link any number of Tasks, Memos, Appointments or other Contacts to a contact.

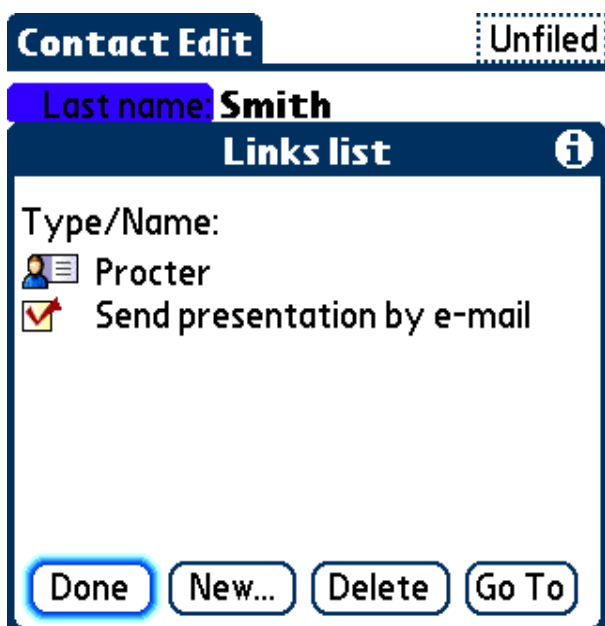


Fig. 2.15.1 – Links List

To edit contact links, tap “Record” menu in the Edit View and select “Record Links” (Fig. 2.15.1)

In the Links List, tap “New...” to add a link, tap “Delete” to delete a link and tap “Go To” to go to a link.

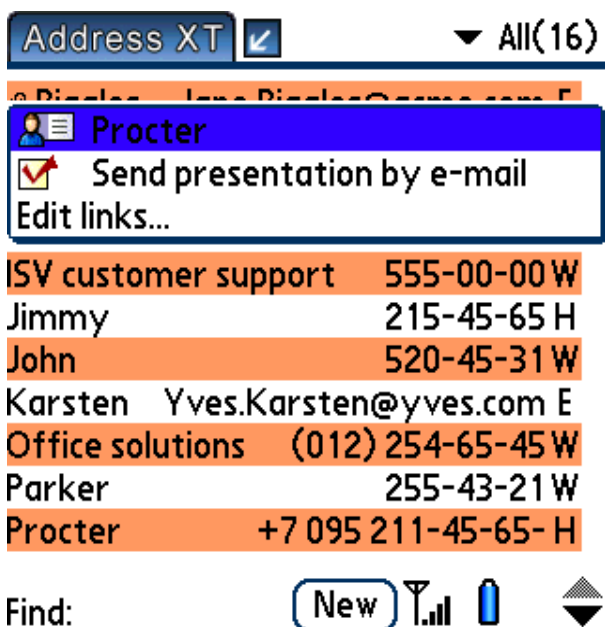


Fig. 2.15.2 – links popup in the Address List

You can access record links easily in Address List and Address View by tapping a paperclip icon near its name (Fig. 2.15.2). Tap a link in the list to go to it.

Links information is stored in a separate database named “LinksDB2”. If you delete Address XT from your device, links information will be also deleted. If you choose to reinstall Address XT, you can restore links information by installing “LinksDB2.pdb” file which is backed up to your Palm Desktop user directory during each HotSync.

2.16 Contact Photos

Address XT features read-only support of contact photos on Zire 72, Treo 650, Tungsten T3, Tungsten T5, Tungsten E, Tungsten E2, LifeDrive Mobile Manager. Note that currently Address XT can only display already set contact photos, you can't edit or remove contact photo using Address XT (later Address XT versions will fully support contact photos).

You can set contact photo using Contacts application or desktop software on Zire 72, Treo 650, Tungsten T5, Tungsten E2, LifeDrive Mobile Manager. On Tungsten T3 and Tungsten E you can only set contact photo using your desktop software.

2.17 Mapopolis and TomTom Navigator integration

You can open your contact's address on a map if you have Mapopolis or TomTom Navigator application installed. To do so, open a contact in View or Edit mode, tap Record -> Contact Map and select an address that you want to open.

If you have TomTom Navigator installed you should choose where street number is located in the address field (or not include it in the request to TomTom Navigator at all if you don't need it).

3. JogDial and 5-Way Navigator support

Address XT lets you take full advantage of JogDial and 5-Way Navigator. For information on whether your device includes one of those, please refer to your documentation.

3.1 JogDial behavior

In any dialog box except Font Selection, Security and Delete Record/Purge Category dialog pushing JogDial functions as tapping the “OK” or “Set” button, and JogDial Back button functions as tapping the “Cancel” or “Done” button.

In Address List, use the JogDial to scroll records in current category. Push the JogDial to go to the Address View screen for a selected record. Push the JogDial Back button to exit Address XT.

In Address View, use the JogDial to scroll records in current category. Push the JogDial to go to the Address Edit screen for a selected record. Push the JogDial back button to go back to Address List screen.

In Address Edit, use the JogDial to scroll record fields. Push the JogDial to go to the Address Entry Details dialog. Push the JogDial back button to go back to Address View screen.

3.2 5-Way Navigator behavior

In any dialog box except Font Selection and Security dialog pushing Select button functions as tapping the “OK” or “Set” button. On Treo 600, Treo 650, Tungsten T5 and LifeDrive handhelds, 5-Way Navigator functions in all dialogs in a standard way for these devices.

In Contacts List, use the 5-Way Navigator to scroll records in current category. Push the Select button to go to the Contact View screen for a selected record.

In Contact View, use the 5-Way Navigator to scroll records in current category. Push the Select button to go to the Contact Edit screen for a selected record. Push the Left button to return to contacts list. Push the Right button to dial selected contact.

In Contact Edit, use the 5-Way Navigator to scroll record fields. Push the Select button to go back to the Contacts List.

The above information about 5-Way Navigation behavior applies to older devices without the “navigation ring” feature. On newer devices, 5-way navigation works in a standard way in most screens.

4. Registering Address XT

Address XT is free to try for 30 days without any nag screens. After this time period ends, you will not be able to run Address XT without registering your copy. During trial period, you may open the About Screen to see how many trial days you have left.

To register Address XT, write down your HotSync name which is mentioned in the About Screen of Address XT and complete purchase on the web site where you've downloaded Address XT, or on the web site mentioned in the Readme.txt file included with this distribution.

When asked for your HotSync name, enter it correctly. HotSync name entry is case-sensitive! Shortly after you payment is processed, you will receive e-mail letter with registration confirmation. Then, you should open the Address XT About Screen again, tap "Register" and enter your registration code.

If you've correctly entered your Serial Number, the About screen, when opened again, will not mention that this application version is not registered, and you will be able to use Address XT for any time period.

5. Troubleshooting

5.1 Birthday reminder screen looks garbled on Sony Clie® device.

The chances are that you're using SwitchDash® application. If you do so, upgrade to the latest version of SwitchDash®.

5.2 JogDial doesn't work as expected on Sony Clie® device.

The chances are that you have JogAssist enabled for Address XT. To disable it, go to Prefs application. Select Jog panel, then tap "Select Applications". Check "Address XT" application.
