User Guide

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Overview

rheaDER is a PDA ebook reader for Palm OS PDAs. Easy-to-use and supporting multiple ebook databases it is an extremely handy tool while on the go. **rheaDER** enables you to add notes and bookmarks to the ebooks you read. The possibilities to look up word definitions in dictionaries, follow Bible references or view images included in ebooks additionally enhance your reading experience.

Version 3.00 is the automated **Reading mode** offering **Manual**, **Auto Scroll** and the **Screen Wrap** features for reading the text. The **Reading mode** will allow you to relax and read ebooks while holding your PDA with one hand, placing it on a surface or on the cradle. **rheaDER** allows you to define a set of reading preferences (font size appropriate for reading longer passages, etc.) so, next time you decide to read an ebook you will already have your reading preferences saved and will fully concentrate on the reading. Using the **Ribbon** feature, a special mark indicating the last paragraph read, facilitates you even more in your reading.

Version 3.19 supports GMPSoft's bilingual dictionaries.

1 Starting the Application

Locate the **rheaDER** icon on the Applications screen of your Palm OS handheld. Launch the application by tapping on the icon.




2 Registration

2.1 Licenses

The GMPSoft licenses for using ebooks with **rheaDER** program are as follows:

1. **Standard License** – The ebook comes with one or two unlocked chapters as a demo. The rest of the chapters are locked until you order the license and install your registration database file, **PADUnlock**.

Note: Locked chapters are denoted by red color in the list of Contents and the free chapters are denoted by green color.



2. **Free License** – The ebook is free to install and read.

2.2 Product Registration


This product can be registered with the help of a small database file, **PADUnlock** (**PA**lm **D**atabase **U**nlock System). You receive your **PADUnlock** file after you order a License for a GMPSoft product and register it in our system database. **PADUnlock** contains the registration information about all products you have ordered from one email address and is in .pdb file format - ready to be installed on your PDA.

1. Get your **PADUnlock**:
 - Follow the Unlock Key link in the GMPSoft Sales Confirmation email you have received after the purchase.
 - Click on **GET IT** link in your **Product Info** page.
 - Save the file on your PC
2. Install PADUnlock
 - Hotsync the **PADUnlock** database to your device's RAM or on the expansion card.
3. Go to the **Registration** form:
 - Launch a GMPSoft product
 - Tap on the **Headline** bar or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Book**
 - Tap on **Registration**

Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **R** on the silkscreen

- Tap on the **Register** button in the trial reminder form

4. Apply your **PADUnlock** registration information:

- Tap on the **Scan** button

GMPSoft products support **PADUnlock** Key protocol and use it to automatically register your products.

Note: The *Trial reminder* form will still appear if there is even one product with a Trial License state.




3 Using rheaDER

The **rheaDER** program allows you to read ebooks taking advantage of the specifics the modern PDA devices provide. The out-of-date paging concept from the times when PDA technology didn't allow text resizing is fully abandoned. Instead, ebooks are divided into logical units. This makes for easy intuitive navigation in the text either with the buttons of your device, or the screen scroller. **rheaDER** allows instant access to the Contents of the active book, addition of personal notes and bookmarks to the text, opening of pop-ups with footnotes and even cross references to the Bible if available for the particular ebook. **rheaDER** supports images and illustrations that may be accessed directly from the text. The possibility for word lookup in a set of dictionaries in **DEPReader** makes **rheaDER** suitable even for in-depth study.

3.1 Select A Book To Read

rheaDER allows users to have multiple ebooks installed and switch between them.

1. Open the **Select Book** form
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the **Book** menu
 - Tap on **Book...****Or**
 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **L** on the silkscreen




2. Scan for new ebooks
 - Tap on the **Scan** button

rheaDER stores cached information about the available databases. This speeds the operation when you use memory cards.

It is not necessary to scan each time. Scan when you:

- Install new ebook(s)
- Delete ebook(s)
- Transfer ebook(s) from handheld RAM to the memory card or vice versa
- Move ebook(s) in another folder of the memory card



3. Choose an ebook
 - Tap on the desired ebook in the list
4. Confirm
 - Tap on the **Done** button

3.2 Select Additional Resources

rheaDER supports other resources such as GMPSoft dictionaries and Bibles that may be used as additional reference while reading ebooks. Word definitions and Bible quotations are displayed with a single tap in pop-up windows without interrupting your reading process. Even more, with multiple dictionaries installed **rheaDER** will allow you to view multiple definitions provided by each one of them.



1. Open the **Select References** form

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the **Book** menu
- Tap on **Dictionary...** or **Bible...**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **D** or **B** on the silkscreen




2. Scan for new Dictionaries and Bibles

- Tap on the **Scan** button

RheaDER stores cached information about the available databases. This speeds the operation when you use memory cards.

It is not necessary to scan each time. Scan when you:

- Install new resource(s)
- Delete resource(s)
- Transfer resource(s) from handheld RAM to the memory card or vice versa
- Move resource(s) in another folder of the memory card



3. Choose one or more Dictionaries

- Enable the **Dictionaries** checkbox
- Enable the checkboxes before one or more of the installed dictionaries

4. Choose a Bible

- Tap on a Bible translation in the list

5. Confirm

- Tap on the **Done** button


3.3 Adjusting the Preferences

rheaDER allows personalizing its layout by selecting a different font size or applying bold formatting that will help you see better the text. As ebooks are divided into logical units rather than into pages, no re-paging will occur.

1. Choose **Preferences** from the **Edit** menu
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on the **Edit** menu
 - Tap on **Preferences**


Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **P** on the silkscreen



2. Text size – you can choose **Smaller** size to have more text displayed at a time or **Larger**
 - Tap on the down arrow next to **Text size** to expand the drop-down list
 - Choose a text size from the drop down list options
3. Apply bold formatting to text – enabling of this option is recommended for people with poor eyesight or in case the light is not sufficient
 - Enable the **Apply Bold Formatting** option

Warning: Enabling bold formatting may remove the distinction between some sections (e.g. subsection headings.)



4. Apply colors – disabling this option will turn off the colors used in the Book texts.
 - Disable the **Apply colors** option
5. Confirm
 - Tap on the **OK** button

3.4 Viewing the Contents of a Book


rheaDER allows viewing book contents and easily accessing the chapters and subchapters of each ebook.

1. Open the **Contents** form

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on the **View** menu
- Tap on **Contents**


Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **C** on the silkscreen



Or

- Tap on the **Contents** icon () in the Headline bar






2. Select a chapter

- Use the scroller bar to scroll the list of contents up and down
- Tap on a chapter in the list of contents

The selected chapter will be highlighted and will be displayed in the footer of the screen.


Some Books may have their chapters divided in subchapters or paragraphs. In such cases, you'll see in the footer the indication of a subchapter (I, 1, a subtitle, etc.)

The grey icon () indicates that an item from the list is a chapter and the blue icon () indicates that it is a subchapter.





3. Select a subchapter or a paragraph

- Tap again on the same chapter in the list of Contents (The Making of... from the previous screenshot)




4. Go back to the full list of Contents

- Tap on the  icon in the **Headline bar**
- Or**
- Tap on the title of the parent chapter in the screen footer (Part I. in this example)





5. Open the selected chapter, subchapter or paragraph

- Tap on the  icon in the **Headline bar**



6. Go back to the last paragraph that you were reading

- Tap on the  icon in the **Headline bar**




3.5 Reading Ebooks

1. Read a section

- Use the scroll bar or you to move the text up and down within a section.
- Use your device's scroll button to move the text up and down within or between sections.

Or

- Move the **Sony Jog Dial** wheel up/down to move the text per one line.



2. Scroll the text up and down by pages

- Use **Page Up/Page Down** buttons, the 5way navigation button of your handheld

Or

- Push the **Sony Jog Dial** wheel and move it up/down.

3. Move between chapters

- Use **Page Up/Page Down** buttons or the 5way navigation button of your handheld

Or

- Push the **Sony Jog Dial** wheel and move it up/down.

3.6 Viewing Illustrations

rheaDER application allows viewing the illustrations available in some ebooks.

Illustrations and pictures are denoted in their proper place in the text with a brief description as blue and underlined links.

1. Display an illustration

- Tap on the link in the text marking an illustration

Orientation: In order to view some of the images properly, you need to rotate your device. The images' orientation is indicated by the *Portrait* or *Landscape* icon in the **Headline bar** before the Image's Title.





Portrait view: The image is orientated properly on the screen.



- Landscape view: The icon suggests that you need to rotate your Palm device in order to view the image properly.

2. View the next or previous image in the same chapter

- Tap on the Forward or Backward arrow in the **Headline bar** to move to the next or previous image in the same chapter




3.7 Viewing Dictionary Definitions


1. Open a pop-up with a word definition
 - Tap on a word in the text and hold the stylus until the pop-up window is displayed

Notes:

1. You need to hold the stylus a little longer than just tap on the screen with it (~ 1/3 sec.)
2. If the word is found in only one of the active dictionary databases, a pop-up will show directly the definition.
3. If the word is found in more than one of the dictionaries, and (or) there are several meanings, the definition pop-up will show a list of the different meanings found in each of the active dictionaries.



2. View a particular meaning of a word
 - Tap on it in the list of word's meanings in the pop-up window
3. Navigate within the pop-up if needed
 - Tap on the scroll bar within the pop-up with the stylus
4. Return to the list of different meanings of the word
 - Tap on the **<<** sign before the dictionary name





5. View a Bible reference found in the definition

References to Bible verses are indicated by the abbreviation of the Bible book and the numbers of chapter and verse, in blue color, underlined.

- Tap on the reference in the definition pop-up

The respective verse(s) from the Bible reference will be displayed on the screen.




6. View a reference to a word

Word definitions may include references to other words in the same dictionary. This is indicated by blue color, underlined.

- Tap on a blue, underlined word in the definition

The definition of the referenced word will be displayed in a new pop-up




7. Return to the ebook text
 - Tap on a blank space within the definition pop-up
 - Or**
 - Tap on the screen outside the definition pop-up

3.8 Displaying Footnotes

rheaDER allows you to view the footnotes available in the text of some ebooks.

The footnotes are indicated by a number in square brackets and are displayed for more convenience as tool-tips and not below the text.

1. View a footnote
 - Tap on the footnote number in square brackets in superscript
2. Close a footnote pop-up
 - Tap inside the footnote pop-up or anywhere on the screen




3.9 Displaying Bible References

The references to the Bible available in some of the ebooks are indicated by a blue and underlined font. If you have installed a GMPSoft Bible, you can visualize the reference by displaying the verses in a pop-up from the text of your ebook.

1. Display a cross reference
 - Tap on a cross reference in the text
2. Close pop-up with cross references
 - Tap on a blank space inside the cross reference pop-up




3.10 Working With Tables

rheaDER allows you to view the tables included in some ebooks. Tables are opened in new screen. Tables may contain one or more columns with entries on a certain topic. The names of the tables are indicated by capital letters.

1. Choose **Tables...** from the **View** menu
 - See how in section....
 - Tap on the **Headline** bar or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **View**
 - Tap on **Tables...**

Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **T** on the silkscreen



2. View Next or Previous Tables

- Tap on the *forward* or on the *backward* arrows in the **Headline bar**

Some ebooks may contain more than one table.

3. Open a table from the text:

Tables are denoted by blue and underlined hyperlinks in the text. To open a table while reading an ebook:

- Tap on the hyperlink indicating a table in the text ([table 1](#) in this example.)

3.11 Reading History

rheaDER keeps a history list of the passages you have visited allowing you to move back and forward in it.

1. Go to the *previous* passage in the history list

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Previous**

Or

- Draw the **Backspace** Graffiti Stroke on the *silk screen*

Or

- Select **Backspace** button in the **Virtual** or the **Hardware** Keyboard

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the **command bar**
- Tap on the *Back* arrow

Or

- Tap on the *Back Arrow* icon in the *Command Toolbar* if it is shown



2. Go to the *next* passage in the history list

- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Next**

- Draw the **Space** Graffiti Stroke on the *silk screen*

Or



- Select **Space** button in the **Virtual** or the **Hardware** Keyboard

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the **command bar**
- Tap on the *Forward* arrow

3.12 User Notes


rheaDER allows you to attach your personal notes to a whole chapter or to each individual paragraph from the ebook you are reading.

Only one Note may exist for a particular section.

3.12.1 Attaching Notes

1. Attach a Note

- Tap on the **Notes** icon  in the *Headline bar*
- Or**
- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Edit Note**
- Or**
- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **I** on the silkscreen




2. Enter your text

- Use the *Graffiti* writing area or the System Keyboard



3. Change the Note category

- Tap on a Notes category displayed at the right top corner of the screen
- Or**
- Click on the **Details** button
- Select a category from the **Category** list
- Tap on **OK**



3.12.2 Edit a Note

You may edit a note, if one exists for a particular chapter or paragraph - Same as 3.12.1.

Note that the icons for Adding a Note () and for Viewing an Existing Note () are slightly different.

3.13 Bookmarks

rheaDER allows you to add bookmarks to the chapters of the ebook you are reading or to each individual paragraph in a particular chapter. As they are connected with a specific ebook, you will not be able to view them if the active ebook is changed.

3.13.1 Adding Bookmarks

5. Choose **Add to Bookmarks** from the **View** menu:


- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Add to Bookmarks**

Or

- Tap on the *Add to Bookmarks* icon  in the **Headline bar**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **O**



3.13.2 Managing Bookmarks

1. Choose **Bookmarks** from the **View** menu:


- Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
- Tap on **View**
- Tap on **Bookmarks**

Or

- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* to display the command toolbar
- Tap on the *Bookmarks* icon  in the **Headline bar**

Or

- Draw *the Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **K**



Note: You need to have at least one bookmark in order to open the **Bookmarks** form.


2. Select a bookmark

- Tap on it in the list

3. Edit a bookmark

You can change the name of the bookmark and the category it belongs to.

- Tap on **Edit**



3.1. Rename the bookmark

By default, the names of Bookmarks include the abbreviation of the ebook and the chapter title or the first few words from the respective paragraph.

- Enter the new name

3.2. Change the category of a bookmark

You can choose the bookmark's category from the list of current categories or create a new category.

- Tap on the triangle button against **Current** category
- Tap on a category in the drop down list

4. View a bookmark

- Tap on **Go To**
- Or**
- Tap on it again

5. Delete a bookmark

- Tap on **Delete**

6. Exit to Book text

- Tap on **Back**

3.13.3 Managing Bookmark Categories

1. Create a new category

- Open the **Bookmarks** form (see how at 3.13.2)
- Tap on **Edit Categories...** from the **Category** list
- Tap on **New**
- Enter the category name
- Tap on **OK**

2. Rename a category

- Open the **Bookmarks** form (see how at 3.13.2)
- Tap on **Edit Categories...** from the drop down list
- Tap on **Rename**
- Enter the new name
- Tap on **OK**

3. Delete a category

- Open the **Bookmarks** form (see how at 3.13.2)
- Tap on **Edit Categories...** from the drop down list
- Tap on category
- Tap on **Delete**



4 Automated Reading Mode

The **Reading** mode of **rheaDER** is especially designed to enhance your reading experience by choosing either **Auto Scroll**, **Screen Wrap** or **Manual** reading modes. The **Reading mode** will allow you to relax and read ebooks while holding your PDA with one hand, placing it on a surface or on the cradle. **rheaDER** allows you to define a set of reading preferences (font size appropriate for reading longer passages, etc.) so, next time you decide to read an ebook you will already have your reading preferences saved and will fully concentrate on the reading. Using the **Ribbon** feature, a special mark indicating the last paragraph read, facilitates you even more in your reading.


4.1 Adjusting the Text Preferences for Reading Mode

rheaDER allows defining different sets of preferences for reading ebooks. For example, you may choose a bigger font size, applied bold formatting etc. for easier reading.


1. Open the **Text Preferences** form
 - Tap on the **rheaDER** bar or use the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Text Preferences...**

Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **F** on the silkscreen



2. Select a **Reading** mode option – these options refer to the navigation. In **Manual** mode you use the **Page Down** button to scroll down, while in **Auto Scroll** and **Screen Wrap** modes the text moves down automatically, you only adjust the speed.
 - Tap on the down arrow on the left of **Reading Mode** field
 - Tap on **Manual**, **Auto Scroll** or **Screen Wrap**



3. Text size – **Medium** or **Larger** are suitable for reading
 - Tap on the down arrow next to the **Text size** field
 - Choose a text size from the drop down list

4. Apply bold formatting to text – enabling of this option is recommended for the **Auto Scroll** and the **Screen Wrap** modes
 - Enable **Apply Bold Formatting** check box
5. View last line

This feature allows you to view the last line of the previous page when paging down the text.
6. Confirm your preferences
 - Tap on **OK**

4.1.1 Auto Scroll Mode


The text in **Auto Scroll** mode is being smoothly auto scrolled up. The user may adjust the speed of scrolling or pause the auto scroll.

1. Initiate Reading
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Start Reading**

Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **G** on the silkscreen

Or

 - Tap on the  icon if you have selected a ribbon to continue reading (See 4.2 *Ribbons*)
2. Increase speed
 - Press and hold the **Page Down** button until you reach the desired speed

Or


 - Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel Downward
3. Decrease speed
 - Press and hold the **Page Up** button until you reach the desired speed

Or

 - Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward
4. Pause
 - Press and hold any of the rest Hardware Buttons (Launcher, Menus, Calculator, Find)

Or

 - Press and hold the Sony Jog Dial wheel
5. Determine the most appropriate speed:
 - Go to a verse you would like to start from



- Start reading (see point.1)
- if you manage to read the text until under 2-3 lines from the centre of the page, press **Page Down** button to accelerate.
- Repeat, until you keep reading the text in the centre.
- Best speed for you is the one at which you read the text close to the centre

Notes:

1. If you have lost concentration, just pause **Autoscroll**.
2. Once you have determined the appropriate for you speed, you need only to use the buttons for Pausing, when you need to stop for a while.
3. If you change any of the Preferences (for example text size), repeat the procedure to obtain the most appropriate speed for the new preferences. If necessary, press **Page Up** beforehand to decrease the speed.
6. Exit the **Autoscroll** mode
 - Press anywhere on the screen - you could do this even by tapping on the screen with your thumb.

4.1.2 Screen Wrap Mode


In the **Screen Wrap** mode, next page is being smoothly rolled down from the top of the screen, while the user is reading the current page. The user may adjust the speed of updating of the screen or may just pause.

1. Initiate Reading
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Start Reading**

Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **G** on the silkscreen

Or

 - Tap on the  icon if you have selected a ribbon to continue reading (See 4.2 *Ribbons*)
2. Increase speed
 - Press and hold the **Page Down** button until you reach the desired speed

Or

 - Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward
3. Decrease speed

4. Once you have determined the most appropriate speed, you need only to use the buttons for Pausing, when you need to stop for a while.
5. If you change any of the Preferences (for example text size), repeat the procedure to obtain the most appropriate speed for the new preferences. If necessary, press **Page Up** beforehand to decrease the speed.

4.1.3 Manual Mode

In the **Manual** mode, the user scrolls the text manually one page/line up with the help of the hardware buttons or the Sony Jog Dial wheel.

1. Move the text per line
 - Roll the Sony Jog Dial wheel downward
2. Move the text per page
 - Press **Page Down** hardware button

Or



4.2 Ribbons

rheaDER allows you to add user marks, called *Ribbons*, in **Reading** mode to save the last passage read in a certain chapter of the current eBookBible book. Next time you start the reader, you may continue reading from the same place. You can have ribbons in different parts of each ebook - for example, in the Preface, Chapter 1, the conclusion etc.

4.2.1 Add a Ribbon

- Go to a place in the ebook from which you would like the to start your reading.
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Add Ribbon**
- Or**
- Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **E** on the silkscreen



4.2.2 Go To a Ribbon

Opens **Bible With You** on the last passage read in the Book, where you have the Ribbon attached.


1. Open **Ribbons** form
 - Tap on the **Headline bar** or the **Menu** button to display the form menu
 - Tap on **Read**
 - Tap on **Ribbons**

Or

 - Draw the *Graffiti Menu Command stroke* ✓ and the letter **H** on the silkscreen

Ribbons are named after the name of the current passage – for example, Introduction, Preface, etc.

2. Select a Ribbon from the list
 - Tap on one in the list
3. Go to the text
 - Tap on **Go To** button
4. Start Reading mode
 - See **4.1.1 Initiate Reading** for instructions



5. Exit Reading Mode

- See 4.1.1 Exit the **Autoscroll** mode for instructions

Note: When you exit the **Reading** mode, the Ribbon will save the information about the last passage you have read.

4.2.3 Delete a Ribbon

- Tap on the **Delete** button in the **Ribbons** form


4.3 Auto Off Power

Palm PDAs have very short intervals for auto-powering off.

To give you more time for continuous reading, **rheaDER** overrides these settings in the Reading mode.

To prevent your battery from draining, a warning message will be displayed 20 minutes after you have started any of the Reading modes.

1. Continue your reading:
 - Tap on OK button
2. Leave Reading mode
 - Tap on **STOP** button



If you don't choose either option within the time interval set for Auto-off in your device's preferences, the Reading mode will be exited and your device will be Powered Off.
